8th International Festival of the Aegean to be Held on Syros, July

The International Festival of the Aegean, which takes place annually on the Island of Syros, Greece, was founded in 2005 by the Greek-American conductor Peter Tiboris. Now entering its eighth season, the Festival attracts world-class musicians, dancers, and actors, and has become a summer destination for lovers of the arts from Europe and beyond.
